Mark Walker is an ardent tractor collector, bitten by the bug just a few years ago when he restored his father's 1957, International Cub-Lowboy. Others have joined the

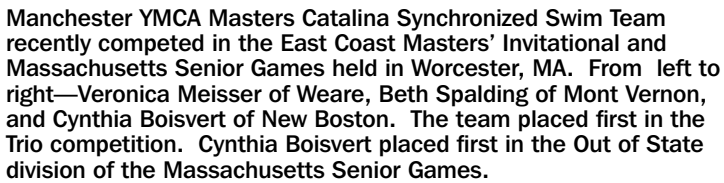

Jonathan Nute, forester and arborist from the UNH Extension Service, gave an excellent presentation as he moved the group from the McCollom Ball Field and the Village School grounds to the Green Lawn Cemetery. He evaluated and detailed remedies for each of a dozen trees and shrubs, and answered many questions from the group. He then systematically pruned several specimen trees in the cemetery and at McCollom Field, using a variety of techniques and tools.
