

The Derryfield Men's and Women's Crew Team traveled to Saratoga Springs, NY for the annual Head of the Fish Regatta. The Head of the Fish is known for cold rain and winds that test the strength of over 6000 athletes on Fish Creek. More than 1400 boats participate in this regatta over a 2 day period.

Fifty kids from the Derryfield Crew Team rowed in 13 different events, many of them rowing multiple times over the course of the day. As usual for the Head of the Fish, shifting winds changed race conditions from minute to minute. While everyone rowed hard, producing great results, highlights of the day were the:

Women's Junior Novice 4 (Mia Sobin (Manchester), Olivia Donahue (Bedford), Meredith Leyden (Bedford), Lucy Steer (Nashua), coxed by Zoe Sobin (Manchester)) placed 7th out of 25 boats - only 3 seconds behind 6th place, Women's Junior 4 A boat (Kelsey Kanik (New Boston), Maddie Kramer (Manchester), Meg Steer (Nashua), Heather Monty (Bedford), coxed by Aran Hubbell (Nashua)) who got 8th place, only 13 seconds behind 1st place.
