There are only three other Class S (small) schools that play field hockey, so the Cougars play in an M-S league with schools that have over twice their enrollment. Junior Elise Shattuck is captain of the JV team, which includes sophomore Rachel Moss and freshman Julie Harris, all of Amherst. The varsity and JV teams trained together daily for part of their practices. The girls really loved practicing and playing home games on their own synthetic turf field this year. The unpredictability of bumpy (and muddy) grass was no longer a factor so they could improve stickhandling skills with
