SHS Boys Varsity Reaches Championship Game of Keene State Holiday Basketball Tournament

Drops Final To Milford

KEENE – The Souhegan High School boys varsity basketball team performed well at the Cheshire Tire Holiday Basketball Tournament held on the campus of Keene State College Dec. 26-29. In the opening round the Sabers handled Mascenic HS 74-32. Senior Mike Bolton had 13 points, 5 rebounds and 5 steals to lead the way for SHS. Other leading scorers were DJ Petropulos with 12, Joe Elich with 10, Jake Gaffney with 9, and Matt Laneve with 8. Petropulos was the Saber's leading rebounder with 9, and Sam Laforet contributed 3 assists.

The semifinals matched Souhegan with Stevens HS and their 6' 10" center Kaleb Tarczewski. Tarczewski lived up to advanced billing with 16 points on 7 of 8 shooting and 8 rebounds, but the balanced team effort of the Sabers was too much for Stevens as SHS prevailed 59-53. Senior captain Joe Elich scored 20 points and grabbed 8 rebounds, while Ryan Redmond had 9 rebounds and 2 steals in only 12 minutes of play. The Saber defense forced 27 turnovers with a pressing attack which proved to be enough

for the win. Senior Mike Dwinell added 13 points with two of his baskets coming at critical moments late in the game to seal it for Souhegan.

The championship game had rival Milford, who defeated Con-val to reach the final, against Souhegan. Souhegan built a 36-30 lead at one point in the 3rd quarter, but Milford went on a 27-10 run to close the game and win the tourney championship by the score of 57-46. Milford was led by tournament MVP Jasmin Handanovic with 24 points and 16 rebounds. Joe Elich led the Saber scoring with 11 points on 5 of 10 from the field, and also added 5 rebounds. Elich and Mike Dwinell were named to the all tournament team for their strong play throughout the event.

The Varsity SHS boys team square off next against Milford at SHS on Monday, January 5 with a start time of 6:30PM. The remaining week's schedule for the Sabers is at Coe Brown on Tuesday, January 6, and then back home at SHS for a matchup with John Stark on Friday, Janu-

Senior Jake Gaffney was the leading rebounder with 8, and junior captain Stephen Daigneau contributed from the point guard position with 4 assists.

Portsmouth, picked by many to be one of the teams in Class I that could contend for a state title, had their hands full with the Sabers as the game went into the fourth quarter tied at 50. But a 22-4 final stanza run sealed the win for Portsmouth, who were led by 27 points from allstate senior John Mulvey.

Track Teams Finish 4th in Ten Team Meet

DURHAM - The Souhegan Sabers track and field teams each finished fourth in a ten-team meet at UNH on Saturday, January 3. In the girls' meet the top scores were Portsmouth 72, Milford 48, St. Thomas Aquinas 45.5, Souhegan 42, and Merrimack Valley 37. In the boys' meet Milford was first with 75 points followed by Portsmouth 57.75, Merrimack Valley 43.5, Souhegan 36.75, and Bishop Brady 20.

Shotputters Chandler Wallisch and Isabella Stuopis led the way for the Saber girls with a one, two finish in the shot with personal bests of 33' 1/2" and 32. Kelsey Knight not only finished third in the hurdles, but her time of 9.7 qualifies her for the Class I Meet. Laura Tebbetts again placed in the dash(4th-7.9), and the 4 by one lap relay team of Laura, Kelsey, Alexis Keable, and Meghan Farley raced to second place(1:34.6). Meghan also sprinted to fifth in the 300 meters(48.9), and Alexis hurdled to sixth place(10.4). Other point winners were Molly Mirhashem in the 600 meters, fifth place(1:54.3), and Leah Demarest, sixth(5:21.9), in the 1500 meters. The 4 by 400 relay team of Molly, Leah, Hillary Wilson, and Jil Sanchez ran their

best time of the season and were third(4:57.5).

Mike Peret again led the way for the boys' team. Mike was first in the high jump(5' 10") and ran a leg on the winning 4 by one lap relay. Parker Hall, Matt Schechter, Ben Stallman, and Mike ran 1:18.6 - setting a new Souhegan High School record. Chris Merra recorded the other first place for the Sabers with a personal record of 4:24.4 in the 1500 meters. Others scoring points were Chris Chininis third in the long jump(18' 6 1/2"); Chris also placed sixth in the 300 meters(41.2). Matt Schechter was sixth in the hurdles(8.8), and Matt Philbrick tied for sixth in the high jump(5' 3"). The 4 by 400 relay team of Matt Chareth, Ryan Stickler, Aaron Prescott, and Paul Thibodeau ran to fourth place(4:04.6).

Twelve Teams Compete in Meet at UNH

DURHAM - Souhegan High School's track and field teams both competed at UNH on Sunday, December 28. Competing with approximately 12 teams from across the state, both boys' and girls' teams finished fourth. Top team scores in the boys' meet were Nashua South 76.5, Milford 61.5, Alvirne 43, Souhegan 30.5, and Hollis/Brookline 22. The top five girls' teams were Alvirne 88, Milford 41, Nashua South 34, Souhegan 31, and Campbell 23.

The Souhegan boys were led by Mike Peret who leaped 6' in the high jump - good not only for a tie for second place but also a new Souhegan indoor track record. Mike also teamed up with Parker Hall, Matt Schechter, and Ben Stallman for a first place finish in the 4 by 160 meter relay. Other place-winners for Souhegan were Matt Schechter 6th in the hurdles(8.8), Dennis Elverson 5th in the 300(41.7), Ryan Sickler 5th in the 600(1:38), and Chris Merra 4th in the 3000(10:10). The 4 by 400 relay team of Chris, Ryan, Aaron Prescott, and Paul Thibodeau also ran to a fourth place fin-
