Local Trash Company Recycles Over 163 Tons

H20 Waste Disposal Services Recycles 328,720 Pounds of Materials in 2008

MILFORD — H2O Waste Disposal Services of Milford is proud in the Souhegan Valley to offer a comprehensive recycling program excited to hear that they can take the Northeast Resource Recycling Association for being active recyclers in 2008. 


