## **Local Resident Granted Patent**

An aircraft in-flight runs the risk of being coated with a layer of ice as it flies through weather due to freezing on its surfaces of su-per cooled water droplets. It is important to know when icing is occurring because the deposited ice adds weight to the aircraft making it harder for the aircraft to maintain flight with the ice deposits also destroying some of the lift produced by the wing and effecting the operation of the aircraft's control surfaces as well.

US Patent 7,439,877 contains a number of improvements for aircraft ice detection not contained in previous patents including the ability to discriminate between ice, rain,

sleet, deicer fluid and snow contaminant layers on the aircraft, a means to identify whether the ice is heavier glaze ice or rime ice and a method that independently reconfirms that the contaminant layer is ice based on a signature exhibited by ice when excited electrically. The patented ice detector is fabricated from relatively inexpensive, miniature electronic chips and devices with all system components contained in a small, thin patch attached to an external surface of the aircraft. The patent is titled "Total Impedance and Complex Dielectric Property Ice Detection System" and was granted to Philip Jarvinen of Amherst.
