May Paddling Trips

The Merrimack River watershed is the fourth largest watershed in New England, spreading through New Hampshire and Massachusetts. At its heart is the Merrimack River, running 180 miles from the White Mountains to the Atlantic Ocean, providing drinking water, power, irrigation, fantastic recreational opportunities and other benefits for the over 1.9 million people living here. Join the volunteer trip leaders of the Merrimack River Watershed Council (MRWC) to discover the beauty of the Merrimack River and the smaller streams that feed it. This year we are offering a total of 35 trips which are free of charge to the public and rated from easy to difficult. More information about the MRWC, details on trip ratings, and a complete listing of trips can be found at www.merrimack.org. Questions about individual trips should be directed to the trip leaders. These trips give everyone, with some experience, an opportunity to explore new rivers or paddle a favorite one in a safe, fun-filled environment.

Merrimack River Watershed Council Paddling Trips May 30 (Saturday) PEMIGEWASSET RIVER, Woodstock, NH (EASY)

A quick-water section that passes by sand banks that house swallows and a few homes that have endured high spring water. The calmer flatwater sections pass by small beaches and swimming holes enjoyed by nearby campgrounds and area residents. Meet at 9:30 am in Woodstock, NH. Rte 93 to exit 30, Rte 3N for 1 mile. Take first right at sign To Rte 175, right at end, then right again onto Death Valley Road (across from Woodstock fire station) to base of bridge.

May 31 (Sunday) PEMIGEWASSET RIVER, Plymouth, NH (EASY)

An attractive section that includes shallow areas with sandy banks and bottom. Most of the trip has good current, changing to flatwater behind Avers Island Dam.

Call first. Meet 9:00 am in Plymouth, NH. Rte 93 to exit 25 to Plymouth. As soon as you cross the river, turn left onto Green St. Launch is on left just past Court House. Call in advance for rentals or email: eflanders1@roadrunner.com.


Student Art Show Continues at the Amherst Town Library
