Speed Warning Device Makes Driving Safer

MONT VERNON—Finding a way to make driving safer has been a challenge for the sixth grade students on First Lego League's Team Journey, but they've risen to the challenge with their invention called the Speed Warning Device.

On Saturday, November 14 at 6 pm at the Mont Vernon Town Hall, Team Journey, which is competing in the upcoming First Lego League program later this month, will give

a community presentation about the Speed Warning Device.

Designed to keep drivers who speed from becoming distracted, Team Journey has created a talking warning system that encourages drivers to slow down before electronically shutting down the most common causes of distraction including cell phones, PDAs and car stereos.

Team Journey will also have their robots, which will be used during the First Lego League competition, on display.
