The Gettysburg College Choir, the premier choral ensemble of the Sunderman Conservatory of Music, will perform a concert at Mont Vernon Congregational Church on Sunday, March 7th at 7:00pm. Also appearing will be the Gettysburg College Camerata, an eight-member ensemble specializing in vocal chamber music. Conducted by Dr. Robert Natter, the ensembles will sing music ranging from Renaissance madrigals to works from contemporary composers. This concert is part of the annual College Choir spring tour, which will include appearances in the Hartford CT, greater Boston, and eastern Pennsylvania regions. The concert is free and open to the public.

Founded in 1935, the Gettysburg College Choir has a distinguished history of performances in the United States and abroad. Recent tour destinations have included Puerto Rico, Nicaragua, Brazil, and Canada, and much of the eastern seaboard. The Camerata provides a vocal chamber music experience in which just eight singers – all members of the College Choir – sing music for smaller ensembles, often with just a single voice on a part.

The Sunderman Conservatory of Music at Gettysburg College Situated on 200 acres of rolling Pennsylvania countryside, the Gettysburg College campus has 60 buildings with state-of-the-art facilities.
