Taken together the works represent the colorful range of contemporary abstraction and thoughtful visual intentions, and even some humor, being executed in the Keene area today. KSC Art Department alumni Molly Fletcher ('07), Brian Jenkins ('90), Jim Murphy ('80), Mike Reilly ('90) will show their work

alongside current and past adjunct Art faculty Craig Stockwell, Stephanie Nichols, and Bruce Blanchette, artists Carmela Azzaro, Deborah Lloyd Kaufman, and Robert Askey have exhibited their works at the college or have taken Art courses as non-traditional students. The Art Department recognizes these artists as friends and part of a family in a wider association of artistic community.

The artworks exhibited explore a variety

of themes with some commonality pertaining to themes articulated from the previous exhibiting artist, Jarod Charzerski: color and landscape in the works of Molly Fletcher, Jim Murphy, Carmela Azzaro, and Robert Askey. A fractured balance of old in new, alluding to recent events in Cairo are suggesteted in the improvisational layout of painter Craig Stockwell. Artist Brian Jenkins has been diligently

producing a painting a week in his studio for the last 4 years- he chronicles a year's worth of his interests and obsessions. The collages of Michael Reilly revisit the eternal theme of still-life with playful exuberance. Nichol's sense of delicate light is echoed in the gestural paintings of Deborah Lloyd Kaufman.
