## Program on Preventing Bullying Offered by SAU 39

On Wednesday, March 9, from 6:30-8:00 p.m., SAU #39 will present a program for parents in the prevention, identification, response and reporting of incidents of bullying or cyberbullying. This presentation is for parents and for parents who volunteer in any school. This program will be conducted at the Amherst Middle School Cafeteria. Child care will be available. The training will be conducted by Sharon Cowen, the Family and Consumer Resources Educator with UNH Cooperative Extension. Sharon Cowen has been working for UNH Cooperative Extension in Hillsborough County since November 2002. Sharon provides county educational programs to individuals, families, and communities in family resource management, parenting, and human development.

The Pupil Safety and Violence Prevention Act, NH Statute 193-F

was amended during the 2010 NH Legislative session. School Districts have specific policy and procedural requirements as a result of this amendment. The districts within SAU #39 are actively working toward fulfilling the legislature's affirmation relative to "protecting children from physical, emotional, and psychological violence by addressing the harm caused by bullying and cyberbullying in our public schools." (RSA 193-F:2, 1).

Throughout the 2010-2011 school year, each school within SAU #39 has scheduled the required developmentally appropriate, evidence based educational programming to their students.

SAU #39 believes that all students have the right to attend public schools that are safe, secure and respectful environments. Each school board has adopted a policy that not only prohibits bullying, but also provides for ongoing prevention and intervention activities in order to protect students.

## Mont Vernon Road Race/Fun Run

MONT VERNON—Spring is just around the corner and that means it's almost time for the 9th Annual Spring Gala 5K Road Race and Fun Run.

On Saturday, May 14, at the Mont Vernon Fire Department on Main Street, runners and walkers of all ages are invited to participate in the one-mile Fun Run or the more challenging 5K road race in memory of McKayla Geisinger.

This year, Race organizers and the Geisinger family have partnered with Neighbor 2 Neighbor Mont Vernon, a non-profit community organization that provides hope and support for Mont Vernon residents.
