Some special exhibits at the MFA require a ticket which is an additional charge - check the website for details.

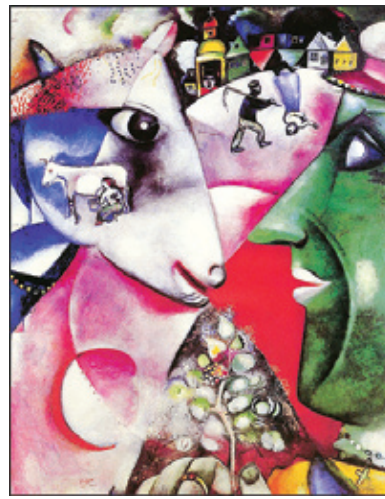
NOTE: Canterbury Shaker Village closed for the season on October 31. Passes may be available again in the spring 2011.

Mont Vernon Road Race and Fun Run

MONT VERNON—Spring is just around the corner and that means it's almost time for the 9th Annual Spring Gala 5K Road Race and Fun Run.

On Saturday, May 14, at the Mont Vernon Fire Department on Main Street, runners and walkers of all ages are invited to participate in the one-mile Fun Run or the more challenging 5K road race in memory of McKayla Geisinger.

This year, Race organizers and the Geisinger family have partnered with Neighbor 2 Neighbor Mont Vernon, a non-profit community organization that provides hope and support for Mont Vernon residents. Through Neighbor 2 Neighbor, McKayla's Project fund has been established to provide support for future community projects or programs.

On race day, check-in and registration for the Fun Run will be held from 7:30 to 8:15 am and the run will begin at 8:30 am. Check-in and registration for the 5K Road Race will be held from 7:30 to 8:45 am and the race will begin at 9 am.

Registration fees for adults are \$15 or \$25 with a special commemorative long sleeve T-shirt. Children are \$10 or \$20 with a T-shirt. Registrations must be received by April 25 if ordering a T-shirt.

Structure Fire on Brook Road

MONT VERNON—The community is rallying to support two families who lost their homes to fire recently.

On Friday morning, February 25, just before noon, fire fighters responded to a home at 20 Brook Road to find the single-family residence engulfed in flames, according to Fire Chief Jay Wilson.

The Mont Vernon Police Chief, Kyle Aspinwall, was first to respond to the scene and reported that fire had overtaken more than 50 percent of the home. The family was able to escape the blaze, but fire fighters were unable to save the house.

Wilson said that the fire was accidental and started on the deck where the homeowner left a cardboard box full of ashes from the wood stove.

"Ashes should always be placed in a metal container and never stored near the house," Wilson said.

The house was insured, and Red Cross and insurance adjusters were on scene to help the family with their immediate needs.

Fire fighters from Amherst, Milford, New Boston, Wilton, Goffstown, Franconia assisted the Mont Vernon Firefighters, who were able to get a short break before the next major building fire broke out just before midnight.

At a single family home at 3 Black Brook Way, a vehicle, parked outside the garage caught fire. The wind apparently caught the embers from the vehicle fire and spread them to the upper floor of the home and the garage overhang. The fire caused significant damage to the second floor of the home, said Wilson, and the lower level suffered water and smoke damage.

The residents of the home were able to escape safely, but two New Boston firefighters were injured when their ladder slipped while they were on the roof of the home. The firefighters slid down the roof and fell to the ground below. They were taken to a local hospital for evaluation and treatment and were released.

Wilson said that there doesn't appear to be any foul play in the fire. The family is currently staying with neighbors.
