

Return of the Faithful!

The view from the window is changing in more ways than one! With the snow melting and daffodils peaking out of the ground, returning migratory birds are filling the air with color and song. All surely a feast for the senses!

If you are fortunate enough to be hosting bluebirds in your yard, they are probably incubating eggs by now. Phoebes return anytime from the end of March to mid-April, and will appreciate nesting shelves. Robins may choose to use them as well! Tree swallows and wrens will be here before you know it, and they'll take any empty boxes not taken by the bluebirds.

If you are still feeding suet, be sure to take it down or crumble it into tiny pieces as soon as it gets tacky in the heat. The "greasy belly" birds get from clinging to the suet feeder gets transferred to the eggs in the nest, particularly a problem for woodpeckers as the embryo in the grease-coated egg may suffocate and never hatch.

Don't forget to put out nesting materials such as materials available specifically for this purpose, or bits of short string, grasses, pet fur, etc and hang in an onion bag.
