

Salem Kiwanis 9th & 10th Grade Track Meet

School records and personal bests were the order of the day for Souhe-gan High school athletes at the annual state-wide 9th and 10th grade track and field meet held at Salem High School on Saturday, May 7. Although the meet was called with several events uncontested, the Sabers scored well against the many Division I schools.

Concord High School led the scoring for the boys' teams with 58 points, followed by Memorial 45, Pinkerton 28, Salem 27, Portsmouth 27, and Souhegan 26. More than 20 teams were in attendance. Ninth grader Ben DeForest hurdled his way to first place in the 110 meter highs with a new school record time of 16.41. He was followed by Ken Dobbs who finished third with a personal best of 17.00. Ben also was third in the high jump with a leap of 5' 8". Other points were scored by Trevor Brown, tied for fifth in the pole vault at 9'. Tanner Kent was sixth in the triple jump with a personal best of 37' 7 1/4", and he was also sixth in the 1600 meters with a clocking of 4:50.77. Jake Kittredge ran the final race of the day, and as the thunder clapped in the background, he crossed the finish line in the 800 meters at approximately 1:59 for second place. The official time, still unknown, may be a new school record as well.

The Saber girls scored 14 points to finish 11th in the competition behind the leaders Winnacunnet 59, Londonderry 48, North 41, and Milford 36. Top finisher for the Saber girls was Caree Pitts. Her personal best effort of 30'5" secured first place for her. Sarah Hurd also had a personal best in the 400 meters and her time of 63.62 gave her the fifth place ribbon. Also earning fifth place was Sam Prue in the 100 meter hurdles with a time of 18.65. The other point scored for the Sabers was Micaela Wilson's fifth place tie in the pole vault(7' 0"). The Souhegan teams will travel to Portsmouth on Tuesday for a tri-meet

with Trinity and the Clippers of Portsmouth.

Souhegan Track Meet at Pelham 5/03

Both Souhegan track teams were victorious in four-team track meets at School on Tuesday May 3. . Final scores were, for the boys Souhegan, 111.5, Pelham 59.83, Windham 55.33, and John Stark 32.33. Girls' scores were Souhegan 136.50, John Stark 48, Pelham 31.50, and

The Saber girls had four double winners in the meet. Junior Isabella Stuopis won both the shot(36' 3") and the discus(109' 4"). Junior Erin Mac-Donald leaped to first in the long jump)14' 3") and ran the fastest in the 200 meters(27.9). Two freshmen were also double winners. Sarah Hurd in the 800 meters(2:31.6) and the high jump(4' 8"). Her classmate Cammie Fermby-Lavertu tied Sarah in the high jump and triple jumped 30' 8.5" for her other first. Other individual winners for the Saber girls were Micaela Wilson in the pole vault(7' 6"), Pia Marciano in the 1600(5:34.3), and Meghan Gillis in the 3200 meters(12:54.2).

The Saber boys also did well. Freshman Ben DeForest was a triple winner with victories in the high hurdles (16.2), the triple jump (36' 10 1/4"), and the high jump (5' 6"). Ken Dobbs shared first with Ben in the high jump. Also, six other Sabers recorded first places: Jake Kittredge in the 1600(4:45.5), Tanner Kent in the 800 (2:11.4), Dennis Elverson in the 200(24.0), Jason Bender in the 3200(10:45.3), James Tabor in the shot(38' 3"), and Alex Hodsdon in the pole vault(11 0").

On Saturday the ninth and tenth graders will compete in the state-wide freshman-sophomore meet at Salem High School.

Souhegan Track at Nashua North Invites 4/23

On a cold and rainy Saturday the Souhegan track teams competed at the Nashua North Invitational track meet featuring over 20 teams including many Division I schools from NH as well as several large Massachusetts' schools. Although several events including the pole vault, long jump, triple jump, and girls' discus were not completed or contested due to weather conditions, all track events were held along with several of the field events.

The Souhegan girls had a strong day scoring 52.9 points to finish second to Pinkerton's 59.9. Central followed with 47.8. The remaining top ten teams were Londonderry 42.8, Timberlane 40.9, Salem 33, Wakefield, MA 28, Milford 23, Winnacunnet 21, and Hollis/Brookline 18. Erin MacDonald ran well in the rain for the Sabers with a second place in the 200(28.12) and sixth in the 100(13.96). Other second places were Raleigh McElvery in the 800 meters(2:33.68), Csilla Va'mos in the 3200(12:04.58), and Rachel Springmann in the 300 meter hurdles(53.42). Rachel was also sixth in the high hurdles(18.81). Sarah Hurd and Cammie Formby-Lavertu shared third place in the high jump(4' 7"), and Pia Marciano was sixth in the 1600 meters(5:42.89). The relay team of Raleigh McElvery, Min-Lu Kelly-Durham, Katharine Tebbetts, and Sarah Hurd climaxed the day with first place honors in the 4 by 400.

The Saber boys' team scored 15 points to finish well behind the leaders: Concord 76, Londonderry 60, Nashua South 57.33, Nashua North 46.5, and Tewksbury, MA 40. The 800 meters was Souhegan's best event with Jake Kittredge running second(2:02.23) and Bert DeForest a close fourth at 2:04.48. Other points scored for the Sabers were Ben DeForest, sixth in the high hurdles(17.47), and Andi Coates, tied for fourth in the high jump(5'

On Tuesday the Souhegan track teams continue their vacation meet schedule with a home meet including Monadnock, Lebanon, Sanborn, and Hollis/Brookline.
