Local Students Compete in Regional Lego League Tournament

AMHERST - On November 12, the Wall-E-Xtreme team with participants from Amherst and Mont Vernon competed in the Merrimack Mindstorm Madness First Lego League local qualifier event. The team of 4th and 5th grade newcomers (Tyler Rishkofski, Nathan Stine, Liam Daley and Beau Facey) worked hard for several months producing a working robot, innovative idea and presentation materials. This year's theme was Food Factor and the kids were asked to study food safe-ty issues including contamination and spoilage. A local apple farm, McLeod's Bros. Orchards, was generous enough to meet with the boys and explain some of the troubles they face with food safety. After several meetings of brainstorming and working as a team the boys developed an innovative and informed solution to draw pests away from

the orchard focusing on items already found in nature.

To prepare for the tournament the boys then developed a creative and entertaining presentation to explain their idea to the panel of judges that even included a rap! The team video taped the presentation and has put it on youtube to share their research with the community, to date they have over 200 views. In addition, in just a few shorts weeks they were able to build, test and program a robot to accomplish a set of missions as defined by First Lego League. At the qualifying event the boys competed against 18 other teams and placed a very respectable 8th place in the robot game. Their coaches and parents are all very proud of them for their hard work and deter-
