Book Discussion Program

The next selection in the Daland

Memorial Library's book discussion program will be Destiny of the Republic: A Tale of Madness, Medi-cine and the Murder of a President by Candice Millard. This non-fiction selection relates the story of President James Garfield who overcame poverty to become a nine term congressman before becoming president. His presidency was short, 200 days, and controversial. He died eighty days after being shot

by an assassin. The book was a New

York Times bestseller. The author also wrote River of Doubt which received high praise. The discussion will be held on Sept 8 at 9:30 a.m. and be held at the library. Copies of the book will be available beginning August 5.

The group usually meets once a month and the meetings last an hour and a half to two hours. Participants take turns bringing a light refreshment. No attendance requirement – attend discussions that are of interest. The library purchases a copy of each selection that may be checked out by library patrons when the book is not reserved for the discussion. Multiple

copies of the book are made available through inter-library loan. The program is suitable for adults and open to Mont Vernon residents at no charge.
