## **True Cost of Illegal Immigration**

To the editor:

Once again illegal immigration is in the news, as various media outlets have reported that the Obama Administration is planning some form of amnesty for illegal aliens after the November elections. In the past year, we have seen over 90,000 under-age illegal aliens enter the country, lured here with the tacit approval of Federal Authorities due to their refusal to enforce existing immigration laws. This explosion in illegal migration is a direct result of the Obama Administration extending amnesty to the socall "dreamers" – young people who came here illegally with their parents. If further amnesty is granted, can we not expect new waves of illegal immigrants? When this happens, what will be the costs?

Most estimates you see about the costs of illegal immigration are framed in millions or billions of dollars, and hard for an individual to grasp. So let's look at this in terms of what will be the cost to you, the average New Hampshire taxpayer. A reasonable estimate of the cost of one illegal alien, who receives welfare benefits, food stamps, and medical care, is about \$30,000 per year. If you make the New Hampshire median income of \$60,000, then you annually pay about \$15,000 in federal, state, and local taxes. That means that your entire tax bill, plus one of your neighbors, will be completely absorbed by each additional illegal alien. This is money that cannot be used to educate your children, fix the roads you drive to work on, or provide police and fire protection to your home.

What can be done? You have the opportunity to prevent this problem from occurring. The Congress, through our Constitutional system of checks and balances, has the authority to make the Obama Administration follow the law. But history has shown that can only occur if both the House and the Senate are controlled by the same party. The current Congress, with the Democrat-controlled Senate, is completely ineffective at controlling the excesses of the Executive Branch. It seems unlikely that if the Senate remains in the hands of the Democrats that there would be any meaningful limits placed on future illegal immigration. So you have a simple choice. You can vote for the Republican Senate candidate, Scott Brown, which will ensure control of the Senate shifts to the Republicans, and help stem this tide of costly illegal immigration. Or you can vote for the Democrat candidate, Jeanne Shaheen, which will lead to more illegal aliens entering the country, and will cost you thousands of dollars. The choice is yours.
