She always likes to start with an assortment of papers and paint in layers. This provides a wonderful textural background. The process continues by adding unique or common objects to add depth and character to the piece. The biggest enjoyment she gets from this type of work is the use of her imagination. She loves the challenge of using items in a way that they were not

She is attracted to all colors. That is the reason why the combination of many different papers and fabrics is so appealing to her. She especially loves the old and rusty items that are found by chance. By using them in my art work she is giving them a new purpose.

Museum of Art, UNH Presents Joo Lee Kang and Art Faculty Review

DURHAM, NH -Two new exhibitions, one focusing on ballpoint pen drawings of flowers, animals, and insects by Boston-based artist Joo Lee Kang, the second, featuring art faculty members Michael Cardinali, Brian Chu, Julee Holcombe, Scott Schnepf, and Leah Woods, will be on view at the Museum of Art, University of New Hampshire beginning November 1, 2014. A reception takes place on Thursday, November 6, 2014 from 6-8 p.m. The Museum of Art and its programs are open to the public free of charge. The exhibitions run through December 14, 2014. The Museum will be closed November 11 and November 26-30, 2014.

Joo Lee Kang: Unnaturally Beautiful

Kang's intricately rendered drawings seduce with their opulence and abundance while expressing the artist's concerns about the fragility of the earth's ecosystems. She uses a vernacular of ornamentationlavish wallpaper, decorative ceramics, festoons and swags-to suggest historical periods of decadence and luxurious material consumption. Upon closer examination of the dense monochromatic compositions, the charm fades revealing malformed animals with multiple appendages and misshapen features, or exacting depictions of cat-

erpillars, spiders, and beetles. Kang celebrates the rich biodiversity of the insect-world and the variations in the animal kingdom. Her delicate compositions suggest vulnerability, drawing ornate warning signs of looming natural and man-made genetic catastrophes. The close-up views of insects and genetic mutations attract as much as they repel

Kang says "By drawing mutated animals and plants, I question nature's place in the modern context. What is nature? What is natural? The subjects that I portray in my drawings reflect the ambiguity of such definitions. They show how I feel at loss to describe what is natural in our present day. Cross-breeding, genetic engineering, and so on; the ways in which humans can control and reconfigure the natural rocess becomes more abundant as technology advances. Should the

results of such human-developed processes be construed as a part of nature, or should nature exist independently of human progress?" Kang received her BFA in Painting from Duksung Women's University, Seoul, South Korea, and a MFA from the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston / Tufts Universi-

ty. She is the recipient of numerous awards, including SFMA Traveling Fellowship, St. Botolph Club Artist Grant, Massachusetts Cultural Council Award in Drawing, and Dana Pond Painting Award.
