The Sabers were especially strong in the middle distance events with Eli Moskowitz winning both the one mile (4:28.32) and the two mile (9:39.39). Madeleine Hunt matched Eli in the mile with her first place effort in the girls' one mile (5:21.33). The girls' team also earned first place in the 4 by 800 meter relay with Jane Leighton, Elise Lambert, Hannah Gillis, and Hannah Culver running a combined time of 10:13.62. Also, the girls' 4 by 400 relay received sixth place with Jane Leighton, Hannah Culver, Amy Lambert, and Madeleine Hunt running 4:20.09. Jane also was third in the 400 (62.07) and Elise Lambert fourth in the one mile run (5:41.10).

The boys' team had two relays in sixth place. The 4 by 800 team of Garrett Earley, Billy Seguin, Thomas Lipkin, and Cam Behn ran 8:59.66, and the quartet of Sebastian Eaton, Jerrell Webster, Ben Miller, and Matt Blood ran 45.68 in the 4 by 100.

PELHAM: April 18 – Souhegan track teams competed at the annual Pelham Invitational Track Meet on Saturday, April 18. Over 20 teams, mostly from D-II and D-III schools participated in the day-long event. The boys' meet found Kearsarge the easy winner with 93 points followed by Souhegan 56, Winnacunnet 41, Kingswood 39, and Sanborn 38. Top girls' teams were Coe-Brown 126, Pelham 72.5, Milford 65.5, Lebanon 63, and Winnacunnet 62. The Souhegan girls' team scored 28 points to finish seventh.

Souhegan boys' relay teams paved the way as they finished first in the 4 by 100, second in the 4 by 400, and sixth in the 4 by 800. The 4 by 1 team of Sebastian Eaton, Ali Eweiss, Ben Miller, and Matt Blood ran 45.30 for their first place, and the 4 by 4 team of Sebastian Eaton, Stefan DeShazo, Jonathan Amrein, and Ben Platt was second with a time of 3:46.02. The 4 by 8 team of Thomas Lipkin, Jonathan Amrein, Keelan MacKenzie, and Billy Seguin ran 9:05.16 to secure sixth. Other notable efforts were Eli Moskowitz who was first in the 3200 (9:36.20) and second in the 400 (52.52), Ben Platt second in the 800 (2:00.20), John Nogueira second in the pole vault (10'6"), Sebastian Eaton fifth in the 100 (11.68), and Ben Miller sixth in the 200 (24.30). The Souhegan girls also ran a win-

ning 4 by 800 meter relay with Jane Leighton, Elise Lambert, Emily Ehrenstein, and Hannah Culver running a combined time of 10:00.21. Madeleine Hunt scored in two events: third in the 1600 (5:18.49) and fifth in the 800 (2:25.96). Jane Leighton continued her fine running with a third place effort in the 400 (62.22). Sophomore Shannon Earley ran a strong 3200 meters as she crossed the line with the time of 12:09.04. The remaining point for the Souhegan girls' team was in the final event as Hannah Culver, Jane Leighton, Amy Lambert, and Madeleine Hunt finished sixth (4:30.08).
