Abby Fitzgerald created an actual prototype of the jacket and the team designed a powerful marketing campaign to accompany their pitch, including a promotional spot, detailed financial projections

and the formation of early stage partnerships. Loving Care Zippets plans to give one jacket away to a child in need for every 3 jackets they sell to a paying client. One of the judges was so impressed with their business plan that he offered to personally pay for team's B-Corporation registration fees.
