New Hampshire reveals many photographic opportunities, and more often than not, I find myself mesmerized by a single subject for hours at a time.

When I am looking through the camera it is as if the viewfinder is my picture frame. Macro photography inspires me to interpret textures, shapes and patterns to transform simple subjects into a particular composition, and even into abstract photographs. A developed patience for timing has become my biggest reward. Viewing each subject at all angles in different lighting helps me understand and connect with the natural world capturing it more appropriately.




