(Without the pass tickets \$9 adults and children over one year old, seniors \$8)

Currier Museum of Art

www.currier.org Two passes - each pass admits two (no co-pay)

Current special exhibit: "From Birds to Beasts: Audubon's Last Great Adventure" through August 30, 2015. The Fells – NEW!!

www.thefells.org Two passes for each day of the week (no co-pay)


www.see-sciencecenter.org Three family passes (no co-pay) (Without the library pass, the ticket price for ages three and up is \$8.)

Passes may be checked out for one week. (Take away and FLEX passes are not returned.) Late returns will incur a \$5 fine. Please call the library at 673-7888, or stop by to reserve a pass. 


